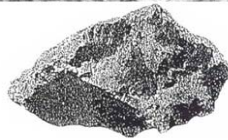


**IN IRAN, STONING A PERSON TO DEATH

Penal Code in the Islamic Republic in Iran

Article 116: Stones should neither be so big as to kill the person at the first blow, nor as small as a pebble. Death must be slow and torturous.

The Islamic Republic kills, tortures and imprisons its own citizens on a daily basis. Under the Islamic Republic, nearly all civil liberties have been eliminated, and discrimination has been institutionalized on the basis of:

- Gender
- Ethnicity and Language
- Religion
- Personal and political views and beliefs

As specified in IRI's Penal Code, lashes, amputation, rape and stoning are common sentences for behavior and actions considered "normal" in most countries. Women convicted of adultery are usually beaten, tortured and raped before they are publicly stoned or hanged. A women's testimony is considered half of a man's in the court of law. Conversion from Islam to another religion carries the death penalty. Free expression of ideas and opinions is severely limited, and the consequence for criticism of the regime in most cases is lengthy prison sentences and torture. Islamic Republic has taken Iranians as hostages for the past 26 years.
